1. Welcome

MedCruise President, Airam Diaz, welcomed the members of the Association at the 54th MedCruise General Assembly meeting.

2. Approval of the minutes of the 54th MedCruise General Assembly

MedCruise Secretary General asked the GA participants to approve the minutes of the 53rd MedCruise General Assembly held in Lisbon, 21 September 2018. The General Assembly approved the minutes unanimously.

3. Membership

Jordi Caballé noted that MedCruise membership, as of the day of the meeting, stands at 72 Regular Members and 31 Associate Members.

As regards the 2019 membership fee payments, the Secretary General informed the GA that 58 regular members and 23 associate members had already settled their fees.

The Secretary General informed about the request received at the Secretariat from some Port Members to get a discount on their membership fee for 2019 due to the lack of traffic. BoD members were informed accordingly and decided to not accept the request as this is against the Constitution.

The General Assembly was informed that the associate members Allegra (Montenegro), B&A Europe and Kuoni Destination Management decided to withdraw from their membership.

MedCruise Secretary General also updated the BoD on two new regular members; these are Cape Verde and the Port of Leixões (Portugal). The Secretary General also introduced the new associate members: Ceuta Tourism Board (Spain), Lanzarote Tourism Board (Spain), Puertos del Estado (Spain), Seaway shipping and tourist services (Greece), Terminal Napoli (Italy) and Peninsula Tours (Turkey).

MedCruise Secretary General informed the BoD of the positive developments and listed the potential new regular members, which include the ports Haifa (Israel), Melilla (Spain), Missolonghi (Greece) and Batumi (Georgia). Potential associate members include Shipping and Tourist Services (Greece), La Gomera Tourism Board (Spain) and Five Senses (Greece).

As already discussed during the last general Assembly, the Secretary General recalled that the Secretariat received the application form from ASTICAN (shipyard based in Las Palmas) and Hospital Perpetuo Socorro (hospital based in Las Palmas). Moreover, Doris (LNG terminal developers from France) and Toorbee (tourist app designers from Greece) also showed their interest to become associate members. However, according to Article IV.2.1 of MedCruise Constitution, *Associate Members of this Association shall consist of an entity, public or private, [...] whose activities are: tourism boards, port agents, receptive agents and cruise industry related associations. [...] whose activities are: tourism boards, port agents, receptive agents and cruise*

industry related associations. Any of these four companies fit the Associate member definition until the Constitution is changed and added “cruise-industry-related-companies” as well, which will be studied by the Constitution Amendments Study Committee.

4. Finances

MedCruise Secretary General presented the finances as of 31st of December 2018. The provisional 2018 Budget Balance (Income – Expenses) stands at -137,576.94 euros, which means almost a €2,000 loss less than the budget approved for 2018 in the General Assembly held in Toulon in October 2017.

5. Port and Cities

Caballé reminded to members the survey on promoting destinations near small ports. The aim is to develop potential associate members and destinations which are located nearby our ports. As a result, we will help the Port member and the destination.,

MedCruise metwith the city councils of Barcelona, Venice and Dubrovnik, three destinations that deal with tourism phobia.

Next actions are:

- Launching Promoting destinations' campaign;
- Running a second survey to understand the situation of this year;
- Attending events on cities and destinations in order to strengthen cooperation

6. Professional Development Course

MedCruise Secretary reminded that the PDC registration was opened and that this will take place next month in Genoa. The main topics of the PDC will be:

- What is the future of the technology and how we can integrate technology to our industry and operations?

- How we can turn our routine logistics and operations into successful story telling.

7. North Africa

The Secretary General reminded the decision of the BoD members to create a North Africa Working group composed by those MedCruise members placed in the North Africa region and the Director of Events, Nicky Guerrero. The Secretary General informed about the first meeting of the Working Group which took place in Tunis last February. GA will be updated in any tasks or agreements that the working group will develop. He also informed that the next meeting will be held in Egypt (date TBA).

8. Black Sea

The Secretary General reminded the decision of the BoD members to create a Black Sea Working Group. The Black Sea Working Group is led by the Mr Teodor Patrichi and composed by all MedCruise members of the region.

The Working Group was launched last November in Odessa, Ukraine. This first meeting was also attended by the Secretary General of the BSEC - Organization of the Black Sea Economic Cooperation - who proposed to MedCruise Presidency and to MedCruise Secretariat to host a meeting in Turkey by the end of this year with the aim of promoting the cruise activities in the Black Sea and in the East Med regions. MedCruise is willing to collaborate with them in the organisation of the event.

MedCruise secretary General also informed that the second meeting of the Black Sea Working Group was held in Costanza in February 2019.

Next meeting will take place in Istanbul during the summer. MedCruise Secretary General, on behalf all members of the Black Sea Working Group, expressed their gratitude to Galataport for willing to host the meeting. Moreover, MedCruise President personally thanked Ms Figen Ayan for her input.

9. EU Relations & Policies

MedCruise Secretary General firstly informed the GA that the new Director of European Union Affairs is Mr Pantoleon Skayannis from Port of Corfu. Secondly, he explained the different groups and forums that MedCruise participates in on a EU level:

- **European Ports Forum:** Two new subgroups were created: Blue Growth and Sustainable Ports. Blue Growth sub-group has not been launched. The Director of Environmental Issues, Ms Valeria Magiarotti, is the person in charge of attending both subgroups.
- **European Sustainable Shipping Forum:** MedCruise will apply to be a member of the new sub-groups related to the cruise industry.
- **Stakeholders Advisory Group on Maritime Security:** MedCruise participated in the 53rd and 54th SAGMAS meetings held in Brussels and Lisbon, respectively (November 7th, 2018 and March 7th, 2019))
- **ENISA:** MedCruise attended the first meeting at the end of January about new regulations in cybersecurity.

Next steps:

- Keep attending all working groups above.
- Applying for ESSF sub-groups

10. Collaboration with other Associations

MedCruise Secretary General listed and explained the different collaborations MedCruise has with other associations.

Firstly, MedCruise Secretary General informed about the 3-year contract signed on March, 13th with UBM in terms of advertising and promotion. The contract amount will be €15,000.00 less due to reduction of the number of the printed hardcopies produced by Seatrade on behalf of MedCruise.

Since the last General Assembly, two MoUs have been signed: Spanish Ports and Assoporti. In addition, a MoU with ELIME will be signed next May during Posidonia summit. The Secretary General also mentioned that MedCruise is going to propose Türklüm the signature of a MoU between both associations.

The Secretary General also mentioned that MedCruise is working with ESPO on the Port Funding 2022, CEF Programme.

Also, a meeting with IMO has been proposed and the secretariat is waiting for a response.

The Secretary General mentioned that AIVP invited MedCruise to join and make a presentation during their next event to be held in June 2019, in Riga. MedCruise President highlighted the importance of this meeting.


Finally, the Secretary General informed that MEDports proposed MedCruise to attend their upcoming event in Marseille.

11. Marketing and Promotion

The Secretary General reminded the three objectives of the new marketing plan, the ideas behind each objective and the actions to be taken in order to fulfil each objective as presented in the 52nd GA in Valletta.



MedCruise Secretary General updated the GA on the new website and explained the main differences regarding the current one. He kindly asked members who have not provided the secretariat with their information yet, to send it as soon as possible.

Secretary General reminded that during the last GA held in Lisbon last September it was decided to maintain the Community Manager. Since the 52nd GA - May 2018 - the presence of MedCruise in social media has increased significantly:

12. New and traditional source markets

MedCruise Secretary General informed members that last November the MedCruise Director of New Source Markets, Carla Salvadó, attended the Seatrade Cruise Asia in order to promote the Mediterranean to Asian cruise operators as approved by the BoD.

The Secretary General also mentioned that, for the first time, MedCruise attended the Cruise 360 event held in Fort Lauderdale. The aim of attending this event was to promote the Mediterranean in the USA source market.

During the last China/Asia Working Group it has also been suggested attending other events like the trade show "Routes". Members of the GA will keep updated.

Next steps:

- Continuing attending Seatrade Cruise Asia
- Continuing attending Cruise 360
- Attending or finding a kind of visibility in the trade show “Routes” with the aim to get involved with airlines in the USA and China markets

13. Project & Studies

Firstly, the Secretary General updated the GA on the advance of the work regarding the measurement of the impact of the cruise activities on ports/cities destinations. He reminded that MedCruise reached an agreement with the University of Bocconi to develop the unified survey. The unified survey is composed by the three following pillars:

The aim of the Unified Survey is to have the results of as many MedCruise members as possible for then analysing the cruise impact per region and per country. The Secretary General remarked that only aggregated data will be published. However, each port which will participate on the project will receive their own results.

The Secretary General showed the questionnaire to the audience and explained its functioning in depth. He also informed that a poll will be sent to all members in order to know which ones are interested in taking part in the project.

Cristina di Gregori, MedCruise Director in charge of Projects and Studies thanked the working group for their good job.

Secondly, the Secretary General listed and explained briefly the different Interreg projects that MedCruise is working on following the request of diverse members. MedCruise President asked members who are working on projects about the cruise industry and who consider that MedCruise as an association could collaborate with to inform the Secretariat.

Lastly, the Secretary General informed about the new proposal received by Holland America Line during Seatrade Cruise Global. A representative of HAL approached MedCruise to propose providing them with video material from each MedCruise port member they call. Their intention is to show the video in passengers' cabins before calling the port. The Secretariat will contact MedCruise members that receive calls from HAL vessels in order to know which ones are interested in joining the project.

Next steps:

- Distributing Unified Survey guidelines
- Launching the Unified Survey
- Cooperating with other projects
- Starting HAL project

14. Environmental Issues

The Secretary General updated the GA on the decisions regarding environmental and sustainability issues. In the first place he informed about the decision to update the LNG map. Consequently, it has been agreed to run the LNG survey among all MedCruise members again.

Valeria Mangiarotti, MedCruise Director of Sustainability and Environment issues pointed out the importance of the new EU directives regarding sustainability such as LNG and waste management ones.

Next steps:

- Re-launching of LNG survey
- Agreement with Warstila to work on technical aspects of LNG infrastructure in ports and other environmental issues
- Continuing attending meetings and events on environmental issues

18. MedCruise Awards

MedCruise President introduced the new initiative -MedCruise Awards- to the General Assembly. MedCruise awards will be organised annually by the Association, always during a General Assembly. Exceptionally, the first edition of the MedCruise awards will be an independent event which will be held in Genoa on June 25th, 2019 just the day before the start of the Professional Development Course 2019.

The President also presented the three lists of awards categories.

The General Assembly agreed on the creation of the MedCruise awards.

19. Constitution Amendments

19.1. Constitution amendment 1

MedCruise Secretary General reminded the Constitution Amendment regarding the introduction of subcategories to the Associate member category, according to the agreement of being more commercial and attracting new members (cruise industry related companies) voted at 52nd General Assembly held in Malta in May 2018. Each subcategory will have different rights and fees.

19.2. Constitution amendment 2

MedCruise Secretary General introduced the proposed Constitution Amendment regarding the membership fee for regular members. The proposal is to split the regular members in 5 groups depending on the number of cruise passenger handled and apply a different fee for each group.

19.3. Constitution amendments 3

MedCruise Secretary General reminded the Constitution Amendment regarding the creation of a new MedCruise region composed by members located at the Atlantic Ocean. He also informed that in the same line, Tunisian Ports proposed the creation of a North Africa region.

19.4. Constitution amendments 4

MedCruise Secretary General reminded the Constitution Amendment regarding the request received by Port of Livorno (port authority) and Livorno 2000 (terminal operator). Currently Livorno 2000 is the regular member because the port authority resigned of being regular member. Now, with the Italian Port reform, Port of Livorno has merged with Port of Portoferraio (which is already a regular member); hence, Port of Livorno has become a regular member.

19.5. Constitution amendments 5

MedCruise Secretary General presented the Constitutional Amendment proposed by Ms Anne-Marie Blum from Var Provence Club regarding the possibility for the Associate members to vote and be elected for the BoD.

19.6. Constitution amendments 6

MedCruise Secretary General informed that MedCruise member, Port of Corfu, proposed that the travelling costs of the BoD members when representing the Association should be covered by the Association.

19.7. Constitution amendments 7

MedCruise Secretary General presented the Constitutional Amendment proposed regarding the creation of the figure of MedCruise Ambassador and include it on the Constitution.
